About the Christian Forum




After this series we intend to look at "Jesus through the eyes of his disciples."




Wednesday Bible Study

Christian Forum Breakfast with Nick and Tim

"Tell us Your Story"

On Valentine's day the Christian Forum had the privilege of hearing from two of Barclays' senior exec members.

Nick Woods (Managing Director, Head of Central Chief Controls Office) and Tim Main (Managing Director, Global Head of Financial Institutions Group) shared the challenges of living out their faith life in the work environment as well as their testimony and journey of faith.

Key Points:





Tim grew up in a Christian family but had a competitive drive in his earlier work years and grew away from faith by being a "Master of the Universe" finance person.

Having a child prompted him to examine the impact that he had to his daughter. Tim shared how he has a dear friend who he prays together with every morning (for the last 8 years) with 100% transparency about their lives.

Tim quoted Col 3:23 "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters" with a

recent focus on the importance of the Sabbath and having rest and balance.

A key point Tim talked about was "am I doing what I am meant to be doing on the God scorecard every day or the worldly scorecard"

Nick then shared how he had a similar upbringing in that he grew up in a Catholic background and faith was always there, there was no "Damascus moment". Through his early years and into university life, faith was there in the background, but came and went.

This became a bigger thing when preparing for marriage and getting more involved in the local Catholic Church. A similar key point Nick mentioned was "You don't do this on your own", the faith journey requires community.

In the work place, life was about balance; he was quietly Christian and people knew he was Christian. Becoming a Christian at work became a bigger deal when he was invited to join the Embrace ExCo a few years ago giving him more direct involvement in the Christian Forum.
